able targets inside your facility, and analyze your layout. Have a closed-door policy in place, especially for unattended areas in high traffic locations.

Check And Lock All Doors And Windows – Burglars look for easy access. An unlocked door or window can be all it takes to set their criminal activ-

ities in motion. Make sure all doors and windows are secure and protected. Consider adding intrusion detection sensors in addition to locks.

Talk To A Business Security Consultant – People who specialize in business security can offer valuable insight into your business by identifying potential internal and external threats

you may not recognize. These experts will have detailed information on local crime trends, and the eye to discover vulnerabilities within your organization. Beware: Scammers targeting SWEPCO customers

SHREVEPORT – If someone contacts you with threats to disconnect electric service unless you make immediate payment – typically using a prepaid card or another non-traceable form of payment – be alert that you are likely the target of a scam.

Southwestern Electric Power Co. (SWEPCO) continues to receive reports that involve criminals posing as SWEPCO representatives contacting customers and demanding immediate payment. They use phone, in-person and online tactics.

“These scammers are targeting vulnerable groups of people, including seniors, non-native English speakers, and small business owners,” said Karen Wissing, SWEPCO spokesperson.

“If you believe a scammer has contacted you, hang up the phone immediately, delete the email or shut the door. You can verify the status of your account by using the SWEPCO app, logging into

SWEPCO.com or calling us directly at 1-888-216-3523,” Wissing said.

SWEPCO employees do not call customers demanding immediate payment or insist that customers purchase a prepaid debit/cash card to pay a bill. Scammers typically threaten disconnection of electric service and demand immediate payment. They ask the customer to purchase a prepaid debit card, such as a Green Dot card, and ask for the card's number, granting the scammer instant access to the card's funds.

If someone approaches you in person, ask to see an ID badge. SWEPCO personnel should be wearing appropriate company logo shirts, hard hats or ball caps. Look for a SWEPCO truck parked outside. You can verify callers or visitors claiming to be from SWEPCO by calling the customer service line at 1-888-216-3523. If you ever feel you are in physical danger, call 911.

This March, get behind early detection Colonoscopies save lives during National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month

According to the American Cancer Society (ACS), colon cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death among men and women in the United States.

As with many types of cancer, screenings are available to determine if signs of cancer exist. Early detection is often the single most effective means of treating cancer. March is Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month, and CHRISTUS Trinity Clinic is encouraging people to get the screenings that could save their lives.

“With a proper screening, colon cancer can be detected before symptoms develop, when it is most curable,” said Perry Lewis, M.D. with CHRISTUS Trinity Clinic Gastroenterology in Longview. “Colonoscopies are the most effective screenings allowing for examination of the entire colon.”

A colonoscopy is an internal examination of the large intestine and rectum which uses a small camera attached to a flexible tube. As the scope is moved around, tissue samples may be taken with tiny biopsy forceps inserted through the scope. Polyps may be removed, and photographs may be taken. Nearly all colon cancers begin as noncancerous (benign) polyps, which slowly develop into cancer.

“Don't Assume” is the Colorectal Cancer Alliance's 2019 National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month public awareness campaign.

“The idea is really based around taking the appropriate steps to protect your health,” said Angelica Belo, M.D. with CHRISTUS Trinity Clinic Gastroenterology in Marshall. “Don't assume you're too young for colorectal cancer. Don't assume you're alone. As the campaign says, ‘When people stop assuming, they get screened,

they reach out for support, they pay attention to their symptoms and they advocate for their health.’ That is precisely what can make a life-saving difference to our patients.”

Colon cancer can affect anyone – both men and women – and risk increases with age. Some people are at greater risk than others.

Some risk factors include:

- ✓ 50 years of age or older
- ✓ African-American or of eastern European descent
- ✓ Have had cancer elsewhere
- ✓ A family history of colon cancer or colon polyps
- ✓ Lead a sedentary lifestyle?

Three killed in Harrison County plane crash

On March 9, 2019 at approximately 7:30 p.m. State Troopers responded to the scene of a small plane crash in Harrison County, three miles south of the city of Hallsville.

The small personal aircraft, a Cessna T337C was traveling from Dallas to New Orleans when the pilot possibly encountered severe weather. The aircraft lost altitude and crashed in a wooded area on private property. As a result of the crash, the pilot and three passengers were killed.

The pilot was identified as William Robert Kendrick, 51, of Huffman. The three passengers were identified as Rebecca Marsh Kendrick, 47, of Huffman, Kaycee Ann Kendrick, 27, of Farmers Branch and Coty Ray Shrum, 25, of Farmers Branch. All were pronounced by JP Nancy George and transported to Meadowbrook Funeral Home in Marshall. Further investigation and any inquires need to be directed to the FAA and NTSB.

Invest in education, training, reduces maternal deaths

CHRISTUS Good Shepherd Medical Center - Longview joins more than 200 Texas hospitals to reduce pregnancy-related deaths and complications through the TexasAIM program. Hospitals statewide are coming together to reduce the number of deaths due to obstetric hemorrhage, one of the most common causes of death and injury in the days immediately after pregnancy.

TexasAIM is sponsored by the Texas Department of State Health Services, the state's public health agency, in collaboration with the Texas Hospital Association and the Alliance for Innovation in Maternal Health. It seeks to reduce maternal deaths and complications from specific causes by arming hospitals and medical personnel with sets of practices and tools, called maternal safety bundles, that have been shown to make patients safer. The obstetric hemorrhage bundle will help hospitals standardize how they assess women for the risk of hemorrhage, monitor for excessive blood loss and respond in emergency situations.

“Obstetric hemorrhage is one of the leading causes of maternal death, so it is crucial that our caregivers are prepared to treat women who may be at risk or respond effectively when needed in an emergency situation,” said Metosha Brantley, MSN, MBA, BSN, Administrative Director, Women and Children's Services, CHRISTUS Good Shepherd Health System. “By taking an active role in TexasAIM, we are ensuring that we have the practices, procedures and tools in place to provide lifesaving care for our patients.”

In the next phases of TexasAIM, CHRISTUS Good Shepherd Medical Center - Longview and other participating hospitals will implement bundles on caring for women with opioid use disorder and treating severe high blood pressure during pregnancy, two other significant causes of maternal death in Texas.

“Too many women and families are affected by pregnancy complications,” explained DSHS Commissioner Dr. John Hellerstedt. “We know most pregnancy-related deaths are preventable, and this kind of collaboration between health care providers and public health gives us the best opportunity to save mothers' lives.”
