

## Special election set for May 1

There's a special election coming up on May 1, along with the city council election, and this one could help change the course the city's infrastructure and future development.

The City of Gladewater and the Gladewater Economic Development Corporation (GEDCO) are asking voters to approve five propositions that would allow existing sales tax revenue to be used on projects other than just industrial-related opportunities. This election is not a new tax. It is simply allowing GEDCO to use its 1/2-cent sales tax revenue on a wider variety of projects.

"These ballot items are not a request to raise taxes," Gladewater Mayor JD Shipp explained. "They are a request to allow us to diversify our investment with existing tax dollars. Each item must be approved separately. We feel these ballot items represent the best opportunities for diversification for our EDC of today and tomorrow."

Currently GEDCO operates under "Type A" rules. Type A sales tax funding is primarily intended for manufacturing and industrial development. EDCs may use Type A revenue to fund land, buildings, equipment, facilities expenditures, targeted infrastructure and improvements for projects.

The Type B sales tax which the city and GEDCO wish to tap into may be used for any project eligible under Type A rules and several other project types, including quality of life improvements such as professional and amateur sports, tourism and entertainment facilities, convention facilities and public parks; related store, restaurant, concession, parking and transportation facilities; related street, water and sewer facilities; and affordable housing.

Voting will be held from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. May 1 on the following propositions for the Gladewater Economic Development Corporation:

**Proposition A:** The use of a portion of the existing one-half cent sales and use tax for land, buildings, equipment, facilities, and improvements found by the board of directors to be required or suitable for use for professional and amateur sports, including children's sports, athletic, entertainment, tourist, convention, and public park purposes and events, authorized by Section 505.152 of the Texas

## Native son Shepperd celebrated with state marker rededication

Gladewater native son John Ben Shepperd (b.1915-d.1990) achieved much during his busy life, including the high office of Texas Secretary of State and State Attorney General. He also earned many honors throughout his career such as being named an Outstanding Young Man in America in 1949. He served as both the state and national president of the Jaycees, Junior Chamber of Commerce.

Shepperd was honored, and remembered, in a historical marker rededication Saturday at the Gladewater Museum. The event was made even more unique by the fact that Shepperd was responsible for the creation of the historical marker recognition designations that have become staples of communities throughout the state. The plan energized local county historical and art commissions with the designation that each county committee would identify 20 sites, buildings or subjects that merited marking. Shepperd set the goal of 5,000 markers in five years. The accomplishment came much earlier.

## Man arrested in Upshur County murder case

A 31-year-old Diana man was arrested Sunday morning on charges of murdering a 60-year-old Diana man found dead at his home late Saturday evening, said Upshur County sheriff's Chief Deputy David Hazel.

Jeffrey David Swanner is charged with killing Kenneth Wadel Burcalow, who "appeared to be the victim of assault," Hazel said in news releases. Swanner, who resided near Burcalow on Swan Road, remained in Upshur County Jail at Gilmer Monday under \$250,000 bond set by Precinct 4 Justice of the Peace Anthony Betterton, said Hazel.

Burcalow, who was "known to neighbors," was found dead in his home in the 1600 block of that road, Hazel wrote. Sheriff's deputies responded about 11:38 p.m. Saturday to a call on the road, "where witnesses advised they had found an individual deceased," and officers located the body inside the residence.

Deputies arrested Swanner near his own home about 11 a.m. Sunday, Hazel said. The suspect and Burcalow "were known to each other," but "the motive for the incident is still under investigation," the chief deputy said.

Betterton said Monday he pronounced Burcalow dead at the scene Sunday, and ordered an autopsy performed at Southeast Texas Forensic Center outside Tyler. As of Monday, he said, he had not received the autopsy results.

### April is Child Abuse Prevention Month

The latest report on child maltreatment fatalities and near fatalities, compiled by the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services, indicates 251 children in Texas died in fiscal year 2020 due to abuse and neglect. That figure includes 28 children who died after being left unattended in hot vehicles.

During Child Abuse Prevention Month, DFPS is encouraging communities to increase awareness of resources available to help prevent child abuse in Texas. Resources are available at [getparentingtips.com](http://getparentingtips.com).

### DSHS launches Texas vaccine scheduler

With anyone 16 and older now eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine, the Texas Department of State Health Services has launched the Texas Public Health Vaccine Scheduler. It establishes a single place to sign up for a vaccine through multiple public health agencies. Texans can visit [getthevaccine.dshs.texas.gov](http://getthevaccine.dshs.texas.gov) to create a profile and pick a preferred day and time for an appointment. In most cases, people will be matched with the next available appointment in their home counties.

People without internet service or who have difficulty using the online registration tools can call 1-833-832-7067 from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. seven days a week for assistance.

As of Sunday, 7.92 million Texans had been vaccinated, meaning 41 percent of the state's residents have received at least one shot. Some 4.46 million are fully vaccinated. DSHS announced Friday that more than 2.5 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines are shipping out this week — more than double the previous high.

Meanwhile, new COVID-19 cases in Texas dropped again compared to the previous week, with 21,754 reported, down about 20% week to week. The number of deaths dropped to 637 last week, down about 14% from the previous week. Hospitalizations of confirmed COVID-19 patients again dropped, to 2,840 statewide.

### McAdams appointed to PUC

Gov. Greg Abbott has nominated Will McAdams to the Public Utility Commission, subject to state senate confirmation. McAdams will join the sole remaining member of the three-person commission, Chairman Arthur D'Andrea, who previously announced his resignation but agreed to stay on until Abbott could appoint new members. McAdams is president of the Associated Builders and Contractors of Texas and worked for legislators for more than a decade in various senior staff positions.

The PUC came under fire after the disastrous electrical blackouts during the mid-February winter storm, since it has supervisory power over the Electric Reliability Council of Texas, which controls the power grid for most of the state. Nearly half of ERCOT's 15-member board has since resigned.

An investigation by the Houston Chronicle indicates nearly 200 people died in the winter storm, primarily from hypothermia or carbon monoxide poisoning. More than 4 million homes in Texas were without power at the peak of the crisis. As State Rep. Rafael Anchia, D-Dallas, noted in the article, the winter storm death toll was almost double that from Hurricane Harvey in 2017.

### Housing affordability, homelessness exacerbated after storm, pandemic

A Fiscal Notes report from the state comptroller's office indicates median-priced housing in all 10 of the state's largest metro areas is unaffordable to Texans with median incomes. Median income is the point where half the people earn more and half earn less. For example, the median income in Austin in 2019 was \$39,418, according to the U.S. Census Bureau. In Brownsville, it was \$19,432, or less than half of Austin's median. But in both metro areas, a home at the median price — \$491,000 in Austin and \$167,800 in Brownsville — is unaffordable to families whose annual income is at or below the median. (All figures are from 2019, the latest year available.)

The report notes a strong correlation between homelessness and housing affordability. Red-hot real estate markets in those metro areas have driven up home prices and rents. After a dozen years of decreases in the number of homeless people in the state, the number has risen since 2018. The latest count of individuals experiencing homelessness on a given night accounted for nearly 26,000 in Texas.

### Drought conditions blanket two thirds of the state

While drought conditions have improved in the northern Panhandle, they have gotten more severe in South and East Texas, with 68% of the state's land now under drought conditions ranging from abnormally dry to exceptional. According to the Texas Water Development Board, for the first time in five weeks the total area of the state affected by drought didn't increase.

## THE ECONOMIST

### A Milestone ...

Initial claims for state unemployment benefits in the US fell to 684,000 in late March for the first time in a year. Believe it or not, that's important. "Initial claims" sounds like something only an economist could love (and a nerdy one at that).

This weekly statistic represents the first filing for unemployment for a specific claim—basically layoffs or jobs that have recently been eliminated. We normally don't pay much attention to it, but it got more headlines during the pandemic as a weekly barometer for how the economy was faring.

Since records have been kept, the highest numbers we had ever seen were 695,000 at the worst of the 1980s downturn and 665,000 during the Great Recession over a decade ago. That was, however, before the pandemic surfaced.

In early 2020, as the economy was in its eleventh year of expansion, initial claims were lower than they had been in decades at around 200,000 (there are always some just due to the churn in the economy). For the week of March 7, 2020, initial claims were 211,000. Just two weeks later on March 28, they were 6,867,000 (about ten times the historic high)!

Through April of last year, initial claims remained stratospherically high, with over 6.6 million on April 4, 5.2

million on April 11, and 4.4 million on April 18. A total of nearly 20.2 million initial claims were filed in April, with 12.3 million more in May. Those were dark days, and the jobs lost all too often brought tragic human costs including financial distress, failing businesses, or insufficient money for basic necessities.

Through the summer and fall, millions more initial claims were filed. While some of these filings represent individuals who were dropped, rehired, and then unemployed again, the scope of the disrupted lives is difficult to comprehend.

To cross below 700,000 new claims finally puts the economy back to a place it's been before--high by any standard, but not unprecedented. Equally important, when we

have seen this level in the past, we have successfully returned to prosperity in a reasonable amount of time. Simply stated, we have done this before!

When we look back on the pandemic and the economic crisis which ensued, we will no doubt take note of when the bad news settled back to a level which is at least somewhat familiar, if infrequent, territory. The coming weeks could well see initial claims bounce back above 700,000 on occasion, particularly if the recent rise in COVID-19 cases morphs into a fourth surge before vaccinations generate sufficient immunity in the population to permit more normal life. Nonetheless, an important milestone in our journey has now occurred. Stay safe!

Doctors often test our physical condition by the state of our tongue. For example, Dr. Ryan Kauffman, M. Thus, what is the character of your speech? What does your words indicate? What kind of health is seen in your tongue? Think on these things.

judge, was the emcee for the event and Gregg County Historical Commission member Gem Meecham shared memories and stories from throughout Shepperd's career. Meecham went to work in Shepperd's office as an intern in 1974 and worked for him until his death. In the anecdotes from family, friends and colleagues, Meecham shared descriptions of the energetic Shepperd as a "one man chamber of commerce", "genuine in his ability to relate to everyone from presidents to barbers", an exceptional communicator and clever, one who never shied away from sharing his thoughts, ideas and opinions.

"Politics is no more crooked and corrupt than any other profession, and it would be much less so if more good people would choose it as a career" Meecham quoted from his writing in "Freedom's Advocate".

Shepperd's roots are firmly established in East Texas pioneer

families with four branches of his family arriving in Upshur and Rusk counties in 1846, 1847, 1848 and 1851.

Public service was a family legacy. His grandfather Ben Phillips served as a state legislator in the 1890s and also was one of the founders of Longview's First Christian Church. His grandfather John Shepperd was the first teacher at Union Grove, and the only one for a period of time, teaching all subjects to all grades. His father, Alfred "Doc" Shepperd was a county commissioner, a school board member and a charter member of Gladewater's Chamber of Commerce and the Lion's Club. Shepperd, himself, also served as a Gregg County Commissioner among the many other positions the attorney held over the course of a lifetime. He embraced his Gladewater roots and credited them for his development while expressing his love for his hometown in a 1976 bicentennial speech he gave in Gladewater.

"One may leave his hometown,

where he was born, and spent his boyhood," he said. "But, his hometown never leaves him regardless of how many times he has seen the elephant and heard the owl, or how many years, miles or pounds have intervened."

Shepperd's accomplishments and personality can be found at the Gladewater Museum where a dedicated exhibit on its second floor contains extensive memorabilia donated by the Shepperd family, Meecham and other contributors. The museum is located at 116 W. Pacific Ave. and is open Fridays and Saturdays from 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. and by appointment by calling 903-845-7608.

Shepperd, a WWII veteran, spent his life in public service along with the support of his wife of 50 years Mamie Streiber Shepperd, concluded many of his speeches with his signature quote which Meecham did as well prior to the marker unveiling. "To be born free is an accident. To live free is a responsibility. To die free is an obligation."

**Proposition B:** The use of a portion of the existing one-half cent sales and use tax for land, buildings, equipment, facilities, and improvements found by the board of directors to be required or suitable for the development or expansion of airport or railport facilities, including hangars, maintenance and repair facilities, cargo facilities, and related infrastructure located on or adjacent to an airport or railport facility, authorized by Section 505.1561 of the Texas Local Government Code, as amended.

**Proposition C:** The use of a portion of the existing one-half cent sales and use tax for land, buildings, equipment, facilities, expenditures, targeted infrastructure, and improvements found by the corporation's board of directors to promote new or expanded business development, authorized by Section 505.158

of the Texas Local Government Code, as amended.

**Proposition D:** The use of sales and use tax proceeds for infrastructure relating to water supply facilities.

**Proposition E:** The use of sales and use tax proceeds for infrastructure relating to water conservation programs.

Early voting will be conducted each weekday at Gladewater City Hall, 519 East Broadway, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. beginning April 19 and running through April 27, and on Friday, April 23 from 8 a.m. until noon. On April 26 and April 27 early voting by personal appearance will be conducted between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m.

Applications for ballot by mail shall be mailed to Judy Van Houten, City of Gladewater, P.O. Box 1725, Gladewater, Texas 75647. Applications for ballot by mail must be received no later than the close of business on April 16, 2021.

## County releases tax lien on local property

Upshur County Commissioners Court last Wednesday approved Gladewater officials' request to transfer the county's portion of a lot in that city to the city government.

The court was told the property at 2810 Hendricks was offered for sale due to unpaid property taxes in 2019, but nobody bought it. Each entity to which taxes were owed owns a portion of the lot, she said, and the city has a \$3,700 lien on the property for removing a house from it.

The city wants to recoup fees it paid for cleaning the lot and is working with a developer so the lot will become a producing property (providing property tax revenue).

a minimum of two scholarships annually. In order for the group to move forward the support of younger and non-participating alumni is necessary.

One of the group's strongest supporters, John Paul Tallent and his wife Beverly, have been at the heart of helping to strengthen the organization and improve the building.

"Without a doubt, the person who we are so indebted to for the GFSA building is Dorothy Anderson, GHS Class of '43," Tallent said. "Her generosity made it possible for all of us in later generations to have the wonderful facility that we have enjoyed for 27 years. She not only donated money for the building, but also for the furniture, appliances in the kitchen, stage and curtains and the landscaping, fence, trees and parking lot on the property."

Anderson's founding contribution also led to the establishment of the KODIAK alumni designation for contributions of \$1,000 or more. Former students from the '30s, '40s, '50s, '60s, and '70s make up the bulk of the group with three from the '80s, one from

1990 and three from the same family.

"There was just something about those former students from the classes of the '30s and '40s that endeared the rest of us to their midst," Tallent said. "Perhaps it was the fact that the women were home missing their beloved guys who were away in World War II. Maybe it was that most of the families struggled financially and worked hard to make ends meet. Whatever those people went through, it made them feel so close to one another. Their bonds were so tight that it was surely noticeable to those of us in later generations."
